

### THE CARILLON

**Greetings First Baptist Family!** 

It is difficult to express in words how eager I am to begin officially as your senior pastor! It is a blessing and an honor I do not take lightly. Brittany and I have been so encouraged by your own response and excitement at our coming. The kind words, texts, letters, cards, and gifts have been so appreciated and have served to warm our heart's affections. We know we are privileged to be able to serve at First Baptist and we can't wait to get started!

As I said to you during my trial weekend, my priority as your pastor is to **Preach**, **Pray**, **Love**, and **Stay**. It is my prayer God will enable me not only to fulfill these first things but also allow me longevity in the task. Please pray with me as I:

**<u>Preach</u>**: Of all things I want to do as the next pastor of First Baptist - I know the very first and best thing is to preach and teach to you the Word of God and hold high God and his work

through Christ before you. This is what you need from me, what our church needs, but also what the Taylorsville community and beyond needs and the Word of God is more than sufficient for the task. With this in mind, please be praying for our upcoming four-week series, "BIG!" in which we will look at the four major parts of my vision for First Baptist - week one: Big Word; week two: Big God, week three: Big Savior, week four: Big Mission.

<u>Pray:</u> The old hymn is simple but certainly gets it right when it says, "Oh what peace we often forfeit, oh what needless pain we bear – all because we do not carry everything to God in prayer". As your pastor, I know the weight and love that I feel for our church and for you individually is too much for me to bear alone. Thankfully, I have the privilege of prayer. Our staff and church leadership are committed to praying for our church individually and corporately and we know that anything the Lord chooses to do at First Baptist is a gift granted through our requests in prayer. Indeed, "Unless the Lord builds the house those who build

*labor in vain" Psalm 127:1.* Commit to praying with us that the LORD would bless our desires for First Baptist and that most of all he would be honored.

**Love:** I echo the words of Dr. Broyles in his *Carillon* comments last month, "We never really begin to know one another until we take the time to sit down and share in general conversation and learn something about the life journey of others". This is the heart beat of Brittany and me. As your pastor, I desire not only to preach to you but also shepherd you. I want to be in your home, have you in mine, visit you in the hospital and times of crisis (not often) ③ we pray and fellowship with you in the community. In the coming weeks and months Carl and I will be contacting you to set up a time to visit with you in your home or over lunch so that I can get to know you and your family better. I am praying you too will follow Dr. Broyles advice and get to know others within the church that you perhaps do not know as well.

<u>Stav</u>: I realize how rare it is for a pastor to stay at one church for an extended period of time and I also do not want to be blind to the fact God sometimes calls pastors to different service for him. However, with all of those caveats stated, I have made it no secret my heart's desire and prayer is to stay at First Baptist for the long haul. I know for some of you I will likely be the last pastor your have and I do not take that lightly. But, I am also hopeful that for some I will be the only pastor you will have known. I do not know what is ahead but I am praying that God in his grace would allow my first pastorate to be my last pastorate.

There is a lot of work ahead for us at First Baptist and I am both excited for it and encouraged because of you. We know there is no "silver bullet" in ministry; we must simply be faithful to God, honor Christ, follow the Spirit, preach the gospel to all, and trust Him for the result. I do not know what our church will be in the next few months, years, or decades but I am committed and by God's grace want to be faithful to these things. Please join me in this and may we all make much of Christ in our hearts, lives, church, this community, and beyond.


"Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O LORD, my rock and my redeemer."

Over the past few months the youth have been studying through the "Spiritual Disciplines". These are the things we do to help us grow in our relationship with the Lord. Things like Bible reading, prayer, worship and fellowship all encourage growth in our spiritual walk.

One discipline we tend to neglect or even shy away from is meditation. To be honest, as Southern Baptists we can fear the word

meditation because it brings about thoughts of Far Eastern religions. We conjure images of people sitting cross legged on a mat, eyes closed and droning OOMMM sounds as they attempt to empty their minds to perfect nothingness. However, this is not the idea the Bible speaks of when it speaks of meditation.



Do you find it difficult to hear God speaking? Maybe you have become cynical and think that God doesn't really speak to people anymore. Meditation is such a help. You see, God has chosen to speak to us through His Word. The Bible is his main method of communicating with us. So why would we as believers not dwell in the Word? Why would we rush to read through it? Shouldn't we take time to listen?

I don't know how many times I have read or heard Psalm 19:14. Several years ago I memorized the passage. And yet today as I write this article it is speaking to me more clearly than ever before. Consider that the words of my mouth are somewhat easy to control. Over time I have developed a filter that helps me keep my mouth in check and not speak exactly what is on my mind at any given time. However, the thoughts, desires and actions of my heart are not so easily controlled. As I meditate on the words "meditation of my heart be acceptable" I realize my heart regularly loses sight of the Lord. While my mouth is often controlled, my heart is quick to spew insults, anger and bitterness. Does this display a heart of complete surrender to our Lord? No, instead it proves that even as a pastor I must invest more time in the Word and meditating to hear God's voice.

#### <u>Friends</u>, as you take time to meditate you will find a few things to be true:

Your need for more time in the Word will grow, which will make you slow down during your designated times of Bible reading.

Your worship will become more purposed as your relationship with the Lord grows.

Your desire to hear from God will grow each day.



Love My Neighbor accepts donations of clothing and household goods. Items may be dropped off behind the building at the

garage door. Everyone who makes a donation will receive a receipt. They are not able to accept stuffed or upholstered items such as sofas, chairs, mattresses, pillows, or stuffed animals. They are also unable to accept large furniture items due to the lack of storage space. If someone has one of these items to donate, the staff is happy to take their contact information to share with people who may have a need. All donated items are laundered or cleaned prior to displaying in the store.

There is an Assistance Policy for customers who cannot afford to pay. Customers may receive 10 free items per month per household member. If a family has an emergency such as a fire, they are eligible to receive additional support.

Love My Neighbor is open at various times throughout the week. First Baptist is responsible for staffing volunteers on Tuesday from 12-4 p.m. Monica

Cox shared how rewarding this ministry is to her and others. "Many customers have stated how much they enjoy shopping on Tuesday

### FIRST BAPTIST PROVIDES ASSISTANCE THROUGH THE BENEVOLENT FUND

Through the "Benevolent Fund", First Baptist Church helps many families in our community when they find themselves in difficult situations. As you may recall, each quarter following the Lord's Supper, members are invited to participate in a special benevolent offering. Additionally, the deacons and friends of the church provide support at various times during the year. These funds are used to help

members of our community that are unable to meet obligations such as rent, utilities, medical/funeral expenses, etc., or unable to provide food for their families. Each family's situation is unique, however when an event such as a job loss, illness/accident, or family death occurs, First Baptist is honored to lend a helping hand.

Families seeking assistance from First Baptist's Benevolent Fund are eligible for help if they reside in Spencer County and request help through the church office. Assistance is generally limited to \$100 and is available once a year. In cases where a family's need exceeds \$100, First Baptist often partners with other local churches or the Spencer County Ministerial Association.




