

Additionally, beginning on Sunday mornings in February, we will start a new sermon series through Paul's letter to the **Philippians**. This series will focus on the joy we experience when we put our faith in Christ. Please be in prayer for this series, for me as I prepare, and for how this series might speak to our church and guests that may attend with us during this time.

I am also excited for our Sunday Evening services at First Baptist. Bro. Carl and myself have sought to subtly add more substance to this special time in which we gather as a faith family. We feel our time has been enhanced as we have added concentrated prayer times in which we ask the Lord to intercede for physical needs, petition God for spiritual need, and offer praise for answered prayers and the blessings we have received from God. In concert with this, we have begun a study through the books of **Ephesians** (continuing through February 10) in which we are examining Paul's command to "walk worthy" of the calling that we have received. This time together as a faith family - gathered with you and joining in song, prayer, and the Word of God has been a precious time for my soul and I pray it has been the same for you. Be on the lookout for a **new Sunday evening series beginning in March** and please make plans to join is if you are not already attending.

Lastly, I want to highlight for you our Wednesday evening adult Bible Study. For several weeks we have been going through various topics related to our Christian faith (Study of God, the Bible, the Trinity, etc.). In the future we will examine more topics like angels, Satan, and demons, study of mankind, sin, Christ, the Atonement, the Resurrection, death and what happens when we die, the church, heaven, etc. While we each may know a fair amount about some of these topics above, it is always good and helpful to 'brush up' or take a closer look at these topics. 





Vicki's Pretzel Salad

2 ½ c. crushed pretzels 3/4 c. melted butter Sugar

1 – 8 oz. package cream cheese, softened 16 oz. cool whip

1 - 6 oz. package strawberry Jell-O24 to 32 oz. frozen strawberries

Mix pretzels, butter and 3 tablespoons sugar. Press into 9 x 13-inch baking dish. Bake at 375 degrees for 10 minutes. Cool completely. Combine cream cheese, cool whip and 1 cup sugar in bowl; blend well. Spread over pretzel crust. Refrigerate for 4 to 6 hours or overnight. Dissolve Jell-O in 2 cups boiling water. Add strawberries; stir until strawberries separate and Jell-O is thickened. Pour over cream cheese layer. Chill for 2 to 3 hours.

Cherry Delight

20 Graham Crackers

1/2 c. confectioners sugar

1/4 c. melted butter

1 - 8 oz. package cream cheese, softened

1 - 8 oz. cool whip

1 c. confectioners sugar

1 - 12 oz. can cherry pie filling

Mix graham crackers, confectioners sugar and butter together in a bowl. Press crust mixture into a 9 x 9 in. pan.

Mix cream cheese, cool whip, and 1 cup of confectioners sugar with mixer until smooth or beat by hand. Spread over graham cracker crust. Top with cherry pie filing. Refrigerate until firm.

Weight Watchers Crustless Strawberry Pie

4 cups strawberries, sliced

1 (5/8 ounce) box sugar-free strawberry gelatin

1 (1 1/3 ounce) box sugar-free vanilla pudding mix

2 cups water

Preparation


Mix together the water and sugar-free pudding mix. Bring to a boil. Remove from the heat and mix in the gelatin. Place the strawberries in a glass pie dish. Pour the pudding/gelatin mixture over the strawberries and chill for at least an hour before serving.

Serves 6. Calories per serving - 38.

Note: Can use other fruit and gelatin flavors such as peach or blueberry. Can pour mixture into individual bowls instead of pie dish.


