A few weeks ago, I asked the adult and youth Sunday School classes to help me by listing their three favorite hymns. The results of this survey were close to what I expected but I must admit there were some interesting findings.

In case you are wondering there was a very close race for the first and second favorite songs with **Amazing Grace** receiving 16 votes and **The Old Rugged Cross** receiving 15 votes. These two songs are long time favorites of mine as well.

So, what is so surprising about that, you may ask? Well honestly nothing at all. I totally expected **Amazing Grace** to be the favorite by a long shot. What is not to love about **Amazing Grace**? The story of how the song came to be a classic hymn is enough to make it a favorite among many.

One of the things I didn't anticipate was the plethora of favorite hymns. Out of 36 people surveyed there were a total of 51 different hymn titles listed. Honestly, I expected about ten different titles to make a strong showing. So, when the titles kept coming and kept coming I decided it was time to analyze things a little bit. Here is what I found:

- characteristic of song preferences. While the youth did list a few "contemporary" songs, they listed some classic hymns as well. And on the flip side, it was interesting to see from the more mature classes mixtures of style and message. One ballot listed a Classic hymn, a southern gospel favorite and a contemporary praise song.
- have special purposes for the people who love them so much. As I looked at the anonymous surveys I realized that many of the people who completed them stuck with a similar theme throughout their choices. Whether the theme was grace, Jesus blood, mercy, God's Faithfulness... whatever it was there were

- many who listed songs along the same theme.
- Our differences in favorite hymns is what characterize our individual natures as we join into one body. I was so pleasantly surprised to find 51 different hymn titles through the survey. It takes so many people to make up the body of Christ. As we have heard before someone has to be the arm and someone else the hand. This applies to our musical choices as well. Each of us love a different hymn for different reasons. We have all had our own set of struggles and successes. Our worship then transforms from the circumstances we have lived through.

Thank you so much for sharing these songs with me and helping me to get a better idea of the church's musical personality. Over the next several months many of these songs will be making their way into our Sunday morning worship services. My hope is our worship can be a place where we draw near to the throne of God, through our music, through our prayer and through the word.


Bro. Chance will begin leading in worship on Sunday, July 29th. Immediately following the worship service, the church will have a lunch

Please pray for the McConnell Family as they make the transition to First Baptist and Taylorsville. We look forward to many years of studying the word of God and serving the Lord together.










PREACH + PRAY + LOVE + STAY

Reflections... For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them. Matthew 18:20

n July 5, 1828 shortly after Taylorsville became an incorporated town, Brothers William Stout, Francis Davis and John Holland, with 15 members, met in Taylorsville, and constituted a church known as the Baptist Church of Jesus Christ.

At one of its first meetings, August 11, 1828, Francis Davis was chosen Moderator Pro Tem and Macum McCollom, permanent Clerk. At this meeting, Reverend William Stout was called as first pastor. It was decided only one Deacon was necessary and Caleb Hardesty was chosen.

This group met in each other's homes for about a year. Then in 1829, the church was incorporated. In 1830, they made plans for a building. Arrangements were made with the Township Trustees for the purchase of a lot on Salt River at the west end of River Street. Caleb Hardesty, John Goodwin, and Macum McCollom were appointed Trustees and given full power to transact any business in connection with the church

building. It was agreed the building would be 50 feet by 30 feet with two galleries 14 feet high. The building was built and occupied and the total membership of the church in 1833 was 76. This building was used for more than ten years and became known as the Baptist Meeting House. It was sold in the year 1841. For the next 16 years the church was associated with the Methodist paying them for the use of one half of their building.

February 19, 1853 the church accepted the resignation of Reverend Stout. In 1857 the church approved plans for a larger facility. The present site of the church was purchased. The new building was dedicated in 1858. A Sabbath School and a Women's Missionary Union was added.

Reverend J.A. Booth was called as pastor in 1885. Plans were made for the construction of the present church building which was dedicated on July 11, 1915. Reverend Booth led the church for 29 years.

During the next five years under the pastorates of Reverend Chesterfield Turner and Reverend A. Mack Parrish a church parsonage was built and Sunday School rooms were added.

Reverend A. Mack Parrish resigned in 1930 after 11 years of service. Under Reverends Carlton Prickett, Walter Blackwell, and E. Warner Fusselle, the church withstood the depression years. A pipe organ was installed in the sanctuary and a modern kitchen was built.

By 1953

under the leadership of Reverend W. Henry Crouch as pastor, the church had grown to 787 members. With Reverends Henry Durham, Paul Grossman, and W.C. Campbell the church continued to grown especially in the Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, and Women's Missionary Union programs.

In 1969 Reverend Harold S. Mauney was called as pastor. In his thirteen years of leadership and ministry, the membership increase by 289 people. The offering receipts more than doubled and the church celebrated the 150th Anniversary on July 23, 1978. In addition to the responsibilities of leading the church and being active in the community, Reverend Mauney earned Doctorate In Ministry Degree from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. Dr. Mauney resigned in September 1981 to accept the position of pastor at First Baptist Church in Williamsburg, Kentucky.

In 1982 Reverend Barry

Dennis was called as pastor. The Josiah Building Fund was established to refurbish the sanctuary, purchase property and build a parsonage adjacent to the rear of the church. Reverend Dennis resigned in January 1989.

In August of 1989, Dr. Robert L. Sutton was called. With his leadership a new educational building was constructed. The building

contained Sunday School rooms, office space, kitchen, and large fellowship area. First Baptist and Second Baptist Churches started a tradition of joint worship serves each fall and a "Pulpit Exchange" each spring. As the church continued to grow in

morning worship attendance, the church voted In 1996, to begin two Sunday morning worship services. Each Sunday, worshippers could attend service before Sunday School at 8:45 a.m. or at the traditional 11 o'clock hour. Dr. Sutton resigned in 1998 and Reverend Timothy Waits was called as pastor in 1999.

During the tenure of Reverend Waits, the church completed two restoration projects. The beautiful stain glass windows in the sanctuary as well as the Tower Bell were both repaired and preserved for many more years of enjoyment. An Outreach Committee was organized and a church website on the internet was developed.

pastor, the church once again entered into a building and restoration program. The old education wing was redesigned from the top floor to the basement. An elevator was installed which enabled access to the upstairs of both education buildings, and a Prayer Garden was created. An area to house the Dare To Care Food Bank was also built. Reverend Mills resigned in September 2017.

For 190 years, God has greatly blessed and provided First Baptist Church leadership, ministries, programs, and resources to share the love of God in Taylorsville, Spencer County, Kentucky, and around the world!

The Spotlight

This month "In the Spotlight" features the Church Library. According to the 1978 First Baptist Church History Book, the library was founded on August 8, 1943. The church was called into conference to hear a recommendation of the Worker's Council of the Sunday School that the church establish a church library. After an unanimous vote, the pastor, Reverend Walter Blackwell appointed a committee to develop the plans. Mrs. Eva Wilkinson a member of the planning committee was

selected as the first Librarian. By November of the same year, the church approved a Board of Directors for the library as well as naming Mrs. Johnston Miller, Mrs. W.M. Blackwell, and Miss Louise Rice as Assistants.

The library was established with a "book shower" and everyone was

invited to attend and donate books. More than 100 books were received. The library was originally located on the second floor behind the sanctuary and was open on Mondays and Thursdays. From the time it was founded until the mid 1950s, many members and friends used the library. In 1944, the church and the Board of Deacons voted the Sunday School would pay \$10 per month for new reading material. By 1953, the church included the Library in the annual budget of \$100 per year.

The Librarian appointed after Mrs. Wilkinson was Miss Louise Rice. Historical documents do not provide an actual date when Miss Rice, a school teacher, assumed the librarian responsibilities. For many years, she made sure the books were

cataloged, shelved, and organized. Miss Rice started a ledger book which contained a list of all the book titles donated or purchased since the library was established. During the early years, the library was a busy place each week.

While many members, mostly the ladies of the church, used the library weekly, one young teen named Lucille Akins Nation, loved visiting and helping Miss Rice in the Library! Since she was a teenager, Lucille has been working in the library starting as an Assistant and then holding the title of

Church Librarian. Lucille said, "When I was in High School I would go to the library each week to look at the books and began helping Miss Rice. She would take me with her to Library Meetings at other churches." Lucille recalls one Sunday, Miss Rice told her "I made you the Librarian at the Church Business Meetina."

For more than 70 years, Lucille has greatly enjoyed the Library and ministering. When the ladies of the church had difficulty climbing the stairs to the library, Lucille would take a collection of books to the ladies at the Sunday School Opening Assembly in the sanctuary or visit their classrooms. Even when they were not able to attend services, Lucille would visit in their homes to deliver and collect books.

Many people used the library each week in the past and supported through reading and monetary donations. However, in the last 10 years, as society has changed with the use of technology, the library has adapted. Two years ago, the church voted to update the library both in the facility and in the book collection. The library was moved from across the church office to upstairs in the education annex building. The book collection was "weeded" and all records were transferred to the computer.

The room is larger and there is

an area for both children or adults to enjoy. In addition to the books, the library contains church archives such as an oil portrait of Reverend William Stout, the first pastor, donated by his family and photographs of several former pastors. Some of the items archived and stored date back to the 1800s.

Lucille is so proud of the new Library and greatly appreciates everyone who worked diligently for many months to make sure the project was completed just precise. She

appreciates all the hours Juanita
Davidson, who served as Assistant Librarian, spent in working on the updates. Lucille enjoys going to the Library each Sunday to sit in her "special chair" and helping Sandra Stewart who is the current Librarian.

Lucille shares, "I have always loved




