I would like to encourage you all to join me in this journey as we prepare for Easter. As we anticipate Resurrection Sunday let's ask the Lord to focus our attention on Him and not all the activity. May we recognize the serious and solemn nature of Good Friday. May we be overwhelmed with the joy that comes on the day of the Resurrection! Then as we join together to worship we will celebrate the Risen King!

FBC will host Community Service March 30th at 12:00 noon Light Lunch Served After the first session of the spring women's bible study was postponed due to ice and snow, the first meeting was held on Monday, February 19<sup>th</sup> with sunshine and record-breaking warm temperature for February! This spring the women will be completing a study on <u>Discerning the Voice of God – How to Recognize When God Speaks</u> written by Priscilla Shirer. Through seven sessions, participants discover the root to clear and daily communication with God – humble obedience. Participants learn how surrender unlocks His many blessings intended for us, centers us in His will, and helps us discern His voice in everyday life. Each session includes a 35-45 minute video tape and personal work book. This year approximately 35 women who are members and friends of FBC are making the commitment to the Bible Study!





This is the fourteenth year, First Baptist has provided a Women's Bible Study. While chaperoning Centrifuge Camp with the youth, Charlotte Nedros attended a class for the adults which was a Bible Study led by Beth Moore. This was Charlotte's first time to participate in a Women's Bible Study and because of her experience, she started the Women's Bible Study at FBC. Charlotte works with the consultants with Lifeway to review 3-4 studies each year as well as praying for God's guidance as the Bible Study is selected for the spring and fall. Courses usually last 7-10 weeks and begin in February and September.

Charlotte is excited about Discerning the Voice of God! "The women have completed other studies by Priscilla Shirer in the past and she teaches lessons that can be used in daily lives. If you were not able to attend the first week, you can still join." The Women's Bible Study has been a blessing to Charlotte and also to the many women who have participated through the years! Please pray for the women as they study the word of God.





It is rise and shine for the men on Tuesday mornings! The Men's Bible Study is off to a fantastic start! Fourteen people joined Bro. Carl for the first meeting on February 6<sup>th</sup> at the Tea Cup located on Main Street. The group has a time of fellowship, breakfast, prayer and devotion.

The Empty Spools Quilting Friends finished their mission project for the newly opened Isaiah House located in Chaplin Kentucky. The Isaiah House is a residentialoutpatient treatment center for men. Their mission is to provide the best possible addiction treatment care for clients and families. In addition to the treatment, they provide job skills training, and lawn care and snow removal services. The members of the Empty Spools have worked together to make guilts for three of the beds in the residential facility.

The guilts were dedicated with special prayer during the February 4th worship service. The guilts were displayed while Lvonne Gilbert shared information about the Isaiah House and the mission project. A label with scripture and a prayer of hope was sewn on the back of each quilt:

### Aunt Geneva's Coconut Cream Pie

This recipe was shared many years ago from my Aunt Geneva Cox Nutgrass of Mount Washington. Geneva is one of seventeen children born to Virgil and Iona Cox and she will celebrate her 93rd birthday this year. Geneva still drives, cooks, travels, cares for her family, attends church each week, and visits with her friends each day at the Dairy Queen in Mount Washington.

#### **Custard:**

3 eggs, separated from whites

1/2 c. white sugar

4 T. self-rising flour

2 c. half & half cream

2 T. butter

1 c. coconut

1 t. coconut flavoring

### **Meringue:**

3 egg whites

2 T. sugar 1 t. cream of tarter

<u>Custard:</u> Mix first five ingredients together and cook on top of stove until thick. Add coconut and coconut flavoring to custard. Pour into 9 inch pie shell.

**Meringue:** Beat egg whites until glossy. Add sugar and cream of tarter. Beat until stiff. Spread on top of pie. Bake at 400 degrees for 10-15 minutes or until the meringue is slightly brown.
