Do you ever find yourself in a situation where you do not know what to do? Maybe you are grief stricken and you do not know how to respond. Or perhaps a friend is going through a trying time and you want to comfort them but do not have the words. Do you find yourself wishing you knew of a scripture reference in that moment that would be helpful?

If you are like me, you want to memorize the scripture, but you find it difficult. Placing all the words in the right order in my brain can be a real challenge. Then, if I do not keep working on the memorization I have a hard time retaining what I have worked so hard to learn.

Therefore, the Kid's Choir has been learning songs that come directly from scripture for the past several months. The passage quoted above from Psalm 55:22 is one of several we have learned. But why? Why would we devote our time to learning songs that are recitations of the Bible?

The answer is simple. We are hiding the Word

of God in our heart to have it for the time when we need it. As we add a melody to a Bible verse we add one more sense to the learning process. Then it makes it much more difficult to forget what we have learned. Or you could say it makes it much easier to memorize.

So why am I explaining all of this to you? It is simple really. Our children need Kid's Choir. They need the opportunity to learn scripture in a way that will hide the Word of God in their heart. They need the scripture to be saved in their heart for those moments later in life when they need it on instant recall.

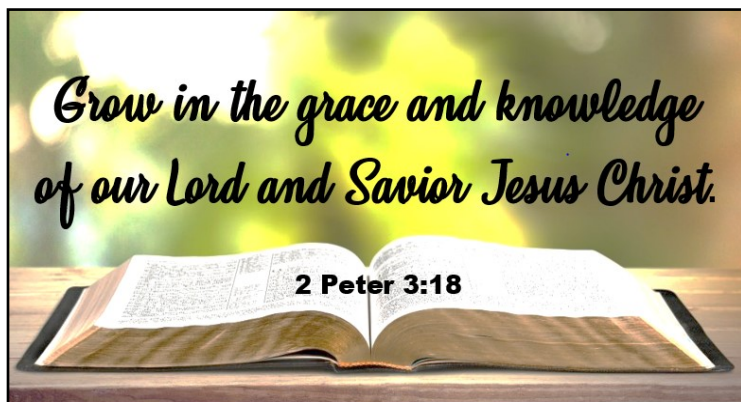

“UNITED WE BUILD” CELEBRATES FIVE YEAR ANNIVERSARY

Many of you may remember that five years ago our “United We Build” construction and renovation project was nearing completion. The \$750,000 project consisted of a major renovation of the educational space directly behind the sanctuary and included many classrooms, a new nursery, a music rehearsal area, a new multi-purpose media and meeting area, a chapel and smaller worship area, a new “Dare to Care” storage facility, a prayer garden, and a new elevator accessing all levels of our campus buildings.

During the month of September, we will be hearing more about how this project has impacted our church and our mission of sharing the good news of Jesus. A small portion of our Sunday morning services in September will emphasize various aspects of the project as well as how many of you have been affected.

To begin the project, the church received a significant number of financial gifts from our members and from the estates of former members. Numerous fund-raising events were also held, some of which continued after the completion of the project.

The balance of the project was funded with a \$600,000 bank loan. This bank loan contained a five-year fixed rate of interest that is now due to be repriced at the current market rates. As many of you are aware, interest rates have risen since then, therefore our loan interest rate is scheduled to reprice around 5.5%. This increase in interest costs can obviously be avoided with any principal payments made prior to October 8, 2018. We have been extremely blessed with your significant and consistent support each week. In fact, through your generosity, along with several major estate gifts and numerous memorial gifts, we have been able to repay nearly \$250,000 of the original principal in just five years!! The Finance Committee has been in contact with the bank and, along with other committees, will be looking at opportunities to reduce the remaining \$350,000 of debt and the related interest costs.

During September, we will be inviting you to consider making additional gifts to apply to our loan before the October repricing. At the anticipated new terms of the loan, each gift will also reduce an equal amount of interest over the life of the loan. For example, an incremental gift today of \$100 will save approximately \$200 of interest and principal. Likewise, a gift of \$1,000 will generate savings of \$2,000 over the life of the loan. These gifts also allow us to repay the entire loan earlier. Wouldn't it be great if we could knock out the remaining \$350,000 over these next five years! Being a “debt-free” church could open so many new ministry opportunities for us.

Please pray about how the Lord is leading you to participate in this important area.

I remember distinctly the moment I decided to give blood. I was caring for a patient with a life-threatening blood disorder while in medical school. This patient required daily blood transfusions to combat the toxicity of their disease and treatments to cure their condition. Unfortunately, we were notified the blood bank was in a critical shortage and struggling to get the supply needed for our hospital and for my patient. So, I made a decision to give and have many times since that experience.

Imagine the gratitude you would feel if someone saved **YOUR** life or the life of someone you loved? Donating blood is an easy way to share your blessings with someone in need and is a most precious gift we can share with others. Every 2 seconds, a person needs a life-saving blood transfusion. Blood transfusions are used for numerous indications, some of which

include: a child with leukemia who is receiving life-saving chemotherapy, a person after a traumatic event such as a severe motor vehicle accident, an adult with multiple chronic conditions whose bone marrow cannot keep up

with their needs, a pregnant woman with complications during child-birth or after a surgical procedure.

Thanks to the work of many of members at First Baptist, we have been able to save the lives of numerous individuals, but we need **YOUR HELP!**

Our blood donations have declined over the past few years so please consider donation. It is another simple way to share God's love with others.

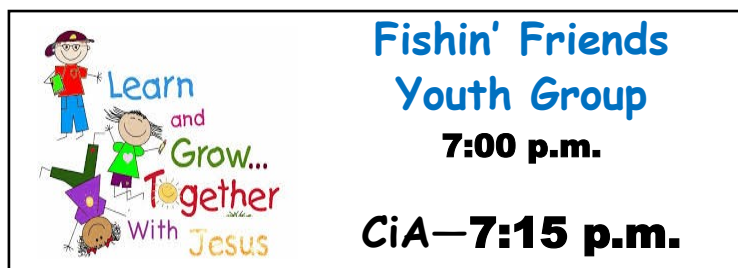
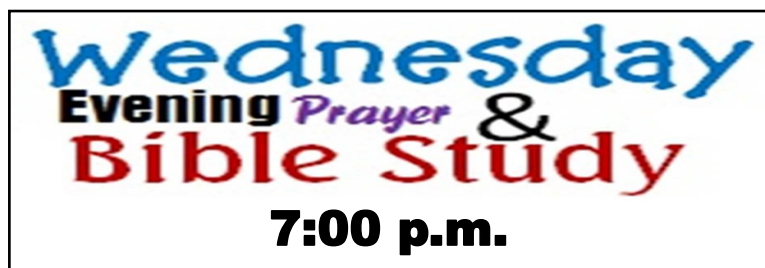

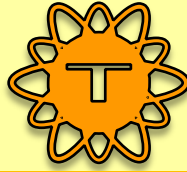
