First Baptist welcomes Rev. John A. Lewis to share

the word of God in worship on Sunday, March 17th during the 11:00 a.m. service. Rev. Lewis was installed as the thirteen pastor of Second Baptist Church on February 4, 2018.

Rev. Lewis has preached the gospel for the past 29 years. He was licensed in Gospel Ministry in 1990 at West Chestnut Street Baptist Church and ordained in the



Gospel Ministry in the year 2000, at 2nd Baptist Church, Taylorsville. KY. He attended Louisville Male High School and Simmons Bible College of Kentucky.

He served Second Baptist Church for the past 23 years, where the Rev. Dr. Charles E. Burton was Senior Pastor. Rev. Lewis served Second Baptist Church as Executive Pastor, Associate Pastor; he served as Minister of Christian Education, and Director of Second Baptist Church, Dare to Care Food Pantry 2009–2015.

Rev. Lewis served as an ordained Deacon at West Chestnut Street Baptist Church 1982-1990. He served as Director Youth Ministry, Superintendent of Sunday School, he served as President of Young Adult Choir, (Voices of Inspiration), and he was Coordinator for Boy Scouts of America, Troop and Pack 32.

Rev. Lewis served as a Commissioner of the Louisville, Jefferson County Human Relations Commission, 2000 – 2003, being appointed by Jefferson County Judge Executive, Rebecca Jackson.

He worked at General Electric Appliance Park for over 40 years, retiring in 2009 after serving as a Union Officer of Local 83761, representing GE employees.

He has served since 2006 and was re-elected in August 2017 as Chairman of the Trustees and a member of the International Union of Electrical Workers Executive Council; the Manufacturing Division of the Communication Workers of America, headquartered in Dayton, Ohio.

He has served since 2006 as a member of the Defense Fund Oversight Committee, of the Communication Workers of America, Washington, D.C. Since 2015 he has served as a member of the Board of Directors of the IUE-CWA Housing Corporation.

Rev. Lewis has been married to Anita L. Lewis for the past 32 years; their family consists of a daughter, 2 sons and 3 grandchildren.



Shrimp Ball

2–8 oz. package cream cheese, room temperature 2 cans tiny shrimp, drained and ri

2 cans tiny shrimp, drained and rinsed well

1 medium onion, finely minced

1 pkg. pecan meal or ground pecan pieces (finely minced)

1 box Ritz Crackers

The amount of the following ingredients - "to taste":

cayenne pepper onion powder

seasoned salt

Tony Crachere's Creole Seasoning

Place pecan mixture in a bowl, add Cayenne Pepper and stir until well mixed. Set aside. Mix cream cheese, shrimp, and onion. Add cayenne pepper, onion powder, seasoned salt, and Tony Crachere's Creole Seasoning to desired taste. Roll into ball on waxed paper; then roll in pecans until covered. Refrigerate for 2-3 hours. Serve with Ritz Crackers. Note: Makes a nice size ball if recipe is cut in half.

Chicken Penne Alfredo

8 chicken tenderloins or 4 chicken breasts Italian seasoning

chicken seasonings

(seasoning salt, smoke maple)

1 jar Classic Alfredo Sauce

1 large jar spaghetti sauce

(Luse 4 cheeses flavor)

1 box (12 oz.) penne noodles

1 bag shredded cheese

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Season and cook chicken in skillet. Sometimes I will cook it in the crockpot with some water to make it juicier. Boil box of penne noodles then drain. Mix penne noodles with the whole jars of alfredo and spaghetti sauces in a large bowl Dice cooked chicken into bite size pieces and add to the noodle mixture in the bowl. Spray 9 x 13 in. pan with nonstick spray. Pour the mixture into the pan. Top with shredded cheese. Place in the oven and cook for 10-15 minutes or until the cheese melts. Serves 4-5.

1 head cauliflower, chopped


1 c. sour cream
