

THE CARILLON



This summer our church was challenged to identify **ONE** person in their life they know is lost or far from God, we called it **Who's Your One?** Imagine if every believer in our church could answer that question with the name of a person who is far from God—a person for whom they are praying and with whom seeking to share the gospel. This is the intention behind **Who's Your One.** We have asked you to identify one person you know (friend, neighbor, co-worker, teammate, family member, etc.) who does not know Christ or who is unchurched. Once the person has been identified we have asked you commit to pray for them, invite them to church, and share the gospel.

There is no question the opportunity is present for us. What if I told you that of the 17,061 people living in Spencer County (according to most recent numbers) only 7 percent of people report that they go to some church somewhere on Sunday morning? Let that sink in, this means 93% of Spencer County, some 15,830 people, do not attend church anywhere on Sunday!

At times, it seems the mission is simply too complex and too vast for churches like ours and people like us. **While we can't do everything, we can do something.** We can all take responsibility for **ONE.** Because of God's power and the work of His Spirit, each of our ones can add up to make a significant impact for God's kingdom.

You have heard me say many times that my desperate prayer is this emphasis will not fade away from us in the coming weeks. You and I need to be diligent to keep this before us.

As I write this, I can see my W.Y.1 card tacked on the wall above my computer. This is meant to be a reminder for me to pray for my one, to seek opportunity to share the gospel with them, and to pray for you as you do the same. I do this because I know if we are not diligent, we will forget, we will move on, and we will not seek our One. Let me be clear, one or two people in our church cannot do this alone. If God is going to use us to grow his kingdom in Spencer County and beyond then **ALL** of us must be on board. Will you continue with me and others in our church?

"The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore, pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

There is a memory that sticks with me from my childhood I hope I never forget. As a 1st grade boy I remember riding the bus to school. I sat with my friend Mike and we were talking about whatever it is that 1st grade boys talk about. Then I asked my friend about church. I asked him if he went to church and if he would like to come to church with me sometime. This is when my world changed forever. Mike turned to me and told me "we don't talk about church at school!". My heart was broken, I didn't

understand why we wouldn't talk about church at school and what that even meant. But I also knew I would be more cautious with my conversations in the future.

Why do I bring up this painful memory? It's simple, it was at this moment in my life I learned to be fearful of sharing the gospel. Before this time, I was quick to share Jesus with whoever would listen. I wasn't scared of rejection from my peers or getting things wrong with my words. I was simply excited to tell people about Jesus because Jesus is wonderful! But at the moment of rejection from my friend my life changed. I suddenly understood there are people in this world who don't want to hear about Jesus. I understood there is a battle taking place to keep the message of the Lord silent. And at once I felt fear in sharing my faith for the fear of rejection from my peers.

Fear is a powerful thing. However, as powerful as fear is, the power of God is stronger! In Isaiah 6 we are given a glimpse into the throne room of Heaven. Isaiah describes in great detail the wonder and glory of his vision. Then as he realizes his unworthiness to be in the presence of God he laments;

*"Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips
and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"*

Notice Isaiah realizes he is unfit to be before God. Yet God's grace and mercy abound as he sends a seraph with a burning coal from the altar to cleanse Isaiah and to say;

"Behold this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for."

The prophet has been relieved of his sin guilt and made right in the presence of God. For those of us who trust in the saving work of Christ on the cross the same goes for us. We have been made right to be in the presence of God! The work that we could not accomplish for ourselves has been done for us!

Now, notice the response of Isaiah. God begins to speak by asking;

"Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?"

And Isaiah responds;

"Here am I! Send me."

As I think back to that day long ago on the school bus, the day fear of sharing the gospel became a stumbling block for me, I think of all the wasted conversations that have passed me by. I think of how unfaithful to the Lord I have been. You see, I have been given the greatest gift anyone could ever receive and yet because of fear I kept my mouth shut.

But I ask you, is the transformational work of God in your life something to keep to yourself? No! Isaiah immediately was ready to share the Word of God to the people. And to be honest, the Word was not very pleasant. But for love of God shown to him and the love of his people Isaiah was faithful to share! Rejection was certain, but knowing the mercy shown to him was far greater than any rejection that might come.

Who do you love enough to share the good news of Christ with? Who's your one that needs the saving grace of mercy of God? Who's your one you pray will come to salvation? Who's your one you will share the love of Christ with?

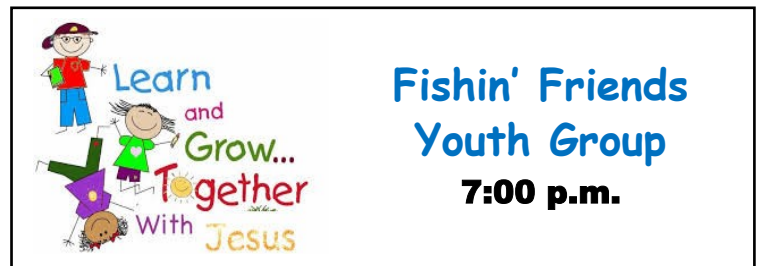
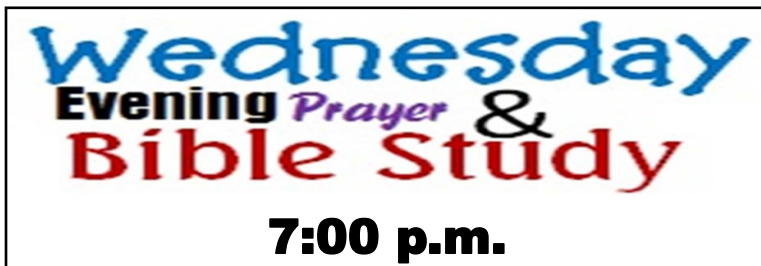
