"Who is This Man?" A Study through the Gospel of Mark "The Things That Make For Peace" Mark 11:1-11 Pastor Chance McConnell March 28, 2021

This passage is a reminder of the power and the plan of the Lord, down to every detail.
No matter how it might appear to others, Jesus this moment.
Jesus's Lordship extends not only to this moment in time but over all things, ncluding His (the donkey that He rode in on).
Jesus will be but not in the way the crowd in Mark 11 expects lim to be.

Application (Take Home Truths)

Jesus's first coming was in humble submission. It was not with pomp and circumstance. He came into this world in a cattle trough and He enters Jerusalem with little fanfare, receiving mostly insincere, confused, misunderstood recognition from the crowds.

Still, He came, and today He stands ready to receive you. Ready to give to you His life in exchange for yours, His righteousness for your sin, and His obedience for your disobedience.

But you must understand Jesus has come and He is coming again. His second coming will not be like the first. He is not coming in humility and offering his life. Rather, He is coming in glory, judgement, and to reign as true king.

Find comfort in God's sovereign plan and power over every detail of this life. Trust that He is working out *all things* for His glory and your good.

Today, would you listen to the savior's words as He weeps over their rejection? Would you know the hour of your visitation - that He has come to save you? This Palm Sunday - this Easter season - is about Jesus Christ crucified and resurrected for sinners.

Do you know this? Do you believe it? Do you know the things that make for peace?

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Palm Sunday marks the occasion when Jesus "set his face to go to Jerusalem" (Luke 9:51) for the last time and rode into the city seated on a donkey amid the welcome and cheers of the crowd.

The Gospel of John notes that they welcomed him with palm branches (John 12:13). After the Maccabean Revolt (167 -160 AD), the Jews rededicated the temple carrying palm branches (1 Macc. 13:51). In Revelation 7:9, people from all nations use palm branches in their worship of Jesus. All four Gospels provide an account of Jesus triumphal entry into Jerusalem (Matt. 21:1–11; Mark 11:1–10; Luke 19:28–38; John 12:12–18).

"Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout, daughter of Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you; righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey." Zechariah 9:9,
