I recently had lunch with a friend of our congregation, Todd Gray, the Executive Director-Treasurer of the Kentucky Baptist Convention. He shared some incredible statistics with me about our church and I wanted to pass on to you. I invite you to celebrate with me the kindness of the Lord to our church over the years!

- From 1980 2021 our church has seen 302 people baptized.
- From 1980 2021 our church has seen 328 other additions to our congregation.
- From 1928 (the year the Cooperative Program began) through 2021 our church has given \$795,388.40 to the Cooperative Program. These dollars have gone to the work of the International Mission Board, North American Mission Board, Women's Ministry Union, seminary education, and more.

Praise God for His work through the selfless generosity of you and so many others. May the Lord be kind to allow us to see even more done over the years to come!


TITUS 2 WOMEN'S MINISTRY

DO YOU KNOW WHERE YOUR FIRE EXTINGUISHERS ARE?

October is National Fire Prevention Month. Do you know why October was selected as Fire Prevention Month? It is in commemoration of the Great Chicago Fire in 1871. The goal is to provide safety awareness and help ensure your home and family is protected.

We, at First Baptist Church of Taylorsville, know firsthand the importance of fire safety. It was not all that long ago, that the Sanctuary of our Church was damaged by fire. It happened during the celebration of the Christmas Advent. Somehow, the candles were left burning and the Advent wreath caught on fire. Thankfully, the sanctuary was not destroyed but there was extensive smoke damage. We learned a very valuable lesson!

It is so important for everyone to be familiar with the location of the fire extinguishers in our Sanctuary. There are actually **four (4) fire extinguishers** either in the Sanctuary or close proximity. The locations are as follows:

In the vestibule of the Sanctuary on the wall
By the piano on the floor
Behind the Pulpit in the choir loft
On the wall in the hallway behind the choir loft

The next time you are in the church, take a moment to look around and familiarize yourself with the location of the nearest fire extinguisher.

Fire safety is even important in your home. Make sure you know where your fire extinguishers are located, change those batteries in your smoke detectors and have a fire safety exit plan!



<u>NOTE</u>: Thank you to the Risk Management Committee for this important reminder. The committee meets regularly to ensure First Baptist is safe and prepared for any issues that may arise.


The Dessert Auction will take place during the meal. All types of sweets are welcome as entries, the sweeter the better!
